# STAND UP LIFTS: **SELECTION GUIDE**



#### Which transfer device to select?

Is the patient able to sit on the edge of the bed, even with the help of another person? Can the patient put both feet on the floor?

## WAYUP and EASYLEV Stand-up lifts

These are **semi-active transfer lifts.** They use the patient's ability to mobilize the bust tonicity. This allows the patient to stand upright by **mechanically unfolding the lower body with the sling positioned at the pelvis level.** 

Due to its **increased movement** and patented principle, the Easylev can **handle taller and/or less toned patients.** It can also **perform a subaxillary lift.** 

#### Positioning of the sling:

- dorsal for the Wayup
- dorsal and sub-axillary for the Easylev.

Choice of base type, «fixed» or «opening legs»: Depending on the chair and the environment.

For example, opening legs base for a Cocoon or fixed base in confined spaces.

### **NAUSIFLY** Patient lift

The Nausifly patient lift is designed for patients with **very low muscle tone** for whom transfer with a **stand-up lift is no longer possible.** 

**Type of transfer:** Leaving the bed, lying or sitting in the middle, from a chair or from the floor. Arrival at bed, chair, wardrobe seat or shower trolley.

#### Selection criteria for the sling:

- The patient = tonicity, head carriage, amputation, etc.
- Transfer = lifting from the floor, going to the toilet, etc.
- Comfort = whether or not the sling should be removed from the chair.

**The choice of a «standard»** or **«compact»** model depends on the living environment (lack of space) and the patient's morphology.
